

## From the ministry team

Sun...sea...sand...shells...salty sandwiches...

Millions of people, including myself, enjoy a trip to the seaside every year - be it Southend or Frinton, Bournemouth or Bognor Regis...or maybe even to beaches beyond our shores. There is something that draws us to this liminal space between the land and the sea.

August itself can feel like a liminal space - especially for those involved in schools and universities. One year has ended, but the next is yet to begin.

I have always enjoyed spending time on the beach, with happy memories of building sandcastles, or paddling in the sea, jumping over the small waves - as well as annoying my parents with all of the shells and stones I would insist on bringing home with me!

As an adult I still enjoy walking along the beach, especially at low tide; listening to the waves gently lapping the shore...and, yes, still collecting the odd stone or shell! I also find beaches, or indeed the coast in general, a good place to connect with God. There is something about the vastness of the body of water stretching out before me that reminds me of the vastness of God - creator and sustainer of the whole universe. Yes the comforting sound of the waves, and the pebbles being moved along by long shore drift, reminds me that though I am just one person - so small compared to God - God created me, loves me, and cares for me.

A few thousand years ago, in a distant land, someone was writing songs for worship in the Temple. Over the centuries the tune of the song has been lost, but the words remain. These songs are now called Psalms, and Psalm 139 says:

How precious to me are your thoughts, God! How vast is the sum of them! Were I to count them, they would outnumber the grains of sand, When I am awake, I am still with you.

Sometimes in the vastness of our world we can feel insignificant - lost amongst the noise and the demands of modern life. Yet in sending his Son, Jesus, God showed his love for each one of us. When Jesus was teaching his followers, he said: "Are not sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground unperceived by your Father... So do not be afraid; you are of more value than many sparrows."

So whatever your plans are for the summer, whether they involve a trip to the seaside or not, may you know how loved and valued you are by God.

## **Raymond Nonnatus**

Those of us who watch Call the Midwife on BBC1 will be familiar with the name Raymond Nonnatus. The nuns featuring in the series belong to the fictional Order of St Raymond Nonnatus, but he was a real person and was canonized in 1657. His feast day is 31 August. St Raymond Nonnatus is recognised as the patron saint of childbirth, pregnant women and midwives so it is fitting that his name was adopted for the programme.

Raymond Nonnatus (1204–40) is a good patron saint for anyone who does not take life for granted. The account of his own life begins with the story of how his mother died just before his birth, and of how Raymond was somehow extracted from her dead body just in time to save him. ('Nonnatus' means 'not born').

Raymond grew up in Portello, Catalonia and became a monk, joining the Mercedarian Order. Perhaps because of his gratitude for his own life having been spared, Raymond developed a passionate desire to see other people set free to live the lives God had given them. Whatever the reason, Raymond made the difficult and dangerous journey out to Algeria in order to redeem many slaves from a living death. So passionate was he to free them, that he even offered himself as a ransom for others' liberation.

While in Algeria, Raymond preached Christianity to the Muslims, and was put into prison, before eventually being sent back to Spain. The Pope sent for him, but Raymond was so weakened by his suffering in Algeria that he died on the way to Rome. But by then Raymond was content. Just as his life had been given back to him, so he had used it to give life back to others.

## We are now a registered charity

I have written before about the reorganisation of our three parishes. Effective from 1 January 2024 the three churches of St Margaret's Downham, St Peter's South Hanningfield and St Mary's Ramsden Bellhouse were joined together into a single parish managed by one Parochial Church Council. We have held two formal public meetings, the first in January to elect two churchwardens and the second in April to elect members to the new Parochial Church Council. Creation of the new PCC has required many administrative changes which have included, a new bank account, registration with HMRC to enable us to claim Gift Aid on eligible donations and registration with the Charity Commission. We have been on something of a merry-go-round because we couldn't register with HMRC or the Charity Commission until we had a new bank account, but banks generally require a registration number before opening accounts for charities. Having exchanged copious letters and

documents everything is finally in place and we are now registered as "The Parochial Church Council of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Downham with South Hanningfield and Ramsden Bellhouse" Charity Registration no 1209033. NatWest Bank couldn't cope with such a long account name and I am sure that few people would want to write all that on a cheque, consequently the Charity Commission and the bank have accepted the working name of Downham Group PCC. If you have occasion to write a cheque to any of the three churches please make it payable to "Downham Group PCC".

At the same time the metal seat around the tree and the lytch gates have also been repainted.



## All in the month of August

#### It was:

300 years ago, on 25 August 1724 that George Stubbs was born. This British artist is best known for his paintings of horses.

250 years ago, on 1 August 1774 that oxygen was discovered by British chemist Joseph Priestley. He was the first scientist to publish his findings on the discovery.

125 years ago, on 13 August 1899 that Alfred Hitchcock was born. This British-born American film director, producer and screenwriter was known as the Master of Suspense. Known for his films The 39 Steps, Dial M for Murder, Rear Window, Vertigo, Psycho, The Birds, and many more.

100 years ago, on 11 August 1924 that the first newsreel of US presidential candidates was filmed. The candidates who appeared included Calvin Coolidge, John W Davies and Robert La Follette.

Also 100 years ago, on 15 August 1924 that Robert Bolt, the British screenwriter and playwright was born. Known for his screenplays for the films Lawrence of Arabia, Doctor Zhivago, and A Man for All Seasons.

90 years ago, on 19 August 1934 that in a referendum in Germany, voters approved the creation of the position of 'Fuhrer', which combined the roles of Chancellor and President into one and gave Adolf Hitler sole power.

80 years ago, on 1 August 1944 that 15-year-old Jewish diarist Anne Frank made the final entry in her diary while hiding from the Nazis in Amsterdam. On 4 August her hiding place was raided by Nazi police following a tip-off. She and her family were taken to Auschwitz concentration camp, and she was transferred to Belsen in October. She died in February 1945.

Also 80 years ago, on 25 August 1944 that Paris was liberated from the Nazis. The Germans had occupied the city for four years. General Charles de Gaulle (later President of France) entered the city in triumph.

65 years ago, on 7 August 1959 that the USA launched the Explorer 6 satellite, which sent back the first images of the Earth from space.

60 years ago, on 12 August 1964 that Ian Flemming, British novelist and creator of the character James Bond, died.

50 years ago, on 8 August 1974 that US President Richard Nixon announced his resignation, effective from noon the following day. He was facing impeachment over the Watergate scandal.

40 years ago, on 1 August 1984 that the preserved body of Lindow Man

(informally known as 'Pete Marsh') was found in a peat bog in Cheshire. It was nearly 2,000 years old. He had suffered a violent death, which may have been part of a ritual.

30 years ago, on 28 August 1994 that Sunday trading was legalised in England and Wales.

Also 30 years ago, on 31 August 1994 that the IRA agreed to a complete ceasefire after 25 years.

25 years ago, on 16 August 1999 that Vladimir Putin became Prime Minister of Russia. He became President in May 2000.

20 years ago, on 11 August 2004 that Britain issued its first license for cloning human embryos, after becoming the first country in the world to allow therapeutic cloning in 2001. Researchers hoped to produce stem cells to treat diseases. They created their first cloned human embryo in May 2005.

15 years ago, on 20 August 2009 that Libyan intelligence offer Abdelbaset al-Megrahi, who was convicted of the bombing of Pan Am Flight 103 which crashed onto Lockerbie, Scotland in December 1988, was released from prison on compassionate grounds after being diagnosed with terminal cancer. He died in May 2012.

10 years ago, on 24 August 2014 that Richard Attenborough, Lord Attenborough, died. This British film actor and director was best known for his roles in Brighton Rock, The Great Escape, Jurassic Park, and Miracle on 34th Street. He directed films including Oh! What A Lovely War!, A Bridge too Far, Cry Freedom and Gandhi.

## **International Bat Night - 24 August**


Members of the congregation at St Peter's may not welcome this as they have a colony of bats in the church and have to protect the interior furnishings from bat droppings.






